

Oklahoma Scholastic Shooting Sports Statement of Purpose:

The Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation recognizes that today's youth will be tomorrow's sportsmen. Shooting sports, like many outdoor activities, are a great source of fun and relaxation when practiced safely and responsibly. The Oklahoma Scholastic Shooting Sports Program (OKSSSP) is focused on providing fun, environment for participating in shooting sports and reconnecting kids with the joy of being outdoors. The OKSSSP will raise awareness of conservation-related sports, promote safety and responsibility, and raise self-esteem.

Rules For Both Contest

Participants Conduct

All participants, coaches, parents, and spectators are expected to always conduct themselves in an exemplary manner by displaying courtesy, consideration, and good sportsmanship to all team members, coaches, competitors, and shooting officials at all times. Any individual not acting as such will be asked to leave the premises. **SAFETY is our main priority!** Any individual caught acting in a fashion unsafe may be asked to leave.

Shooting Contest:

- Sporting Clay (**Oklahoma FFA Sporting Clays Event Handbook**)
- Trap (**Oklahoma Scholastic Shooting Sports Program Handbook, Edition 2016**)

Squad Rotation

- Coaches will choose shooting squads consisting of 5 members. Coaches will be able to pick squads at check in due to circumstances within that club. Those 5 members of that squad will stay together during trap and Sporting clays, NO Switching. Examples: same team members using the same gun, equipment usage, levels of shooters experience, or other needs that are unaware to anyone but that Coach.
- Individual Shooters without a team will be given a time (after entries are closed) and put into a squad for the contest

Field Rules

- The Range Master and safety officer will determine a late pull. The safety officer is the only person who can disqualify a target because of a late pull. The safety officer will call "No Target."
- Wrong targets may accidentally be thrown because of human error. The range manager will call, "No Target." In the event that the range manager does not realize his mistake in time and fails to call, "No Target," and if the shooter assumes the target and shoots, then the target will be scored as either a hit or miss.

- Range master and safety officers will make the calls concerning shooter error versus gun malfunction.
- Shot Tracking, defined as tracing with the shotgun's barrel the flight of a target called by another participant, is prohibited.

Safety

- On the day of competition, ammunition will be checked after the safety meeting and going to the shooting line.
- Except while on the line, all participants must keep firearms unloaded with actions open.
- At no time will anyone load ammunition into a firearm at any location other than the firing line. Loading a firearm at any location other than the firing line will result in immediate disqualification.
- All participants, coaches, and spectators will follow the instructions of the judges, scorers, or event coordinator.
- A coach or parent **MUST** be with the participant from time of check in to time their shoot is over. We will ask if participants' representative is there, during safety meeting, before they are allowed to shoot.
- Closed toe footwear is **REQUIRED!** The use of toe pads or resting of firearm barrels on any part of the foot is strictly prohibited and could result in disqualification.
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Scoring

- The official score is kept by the scorer on an official scoresheet and shall solely govern all scores.
- The judge's decision on whether a target is dead or lost is subject only to the review of the scorer.

Calling Scores and Pulls

- All targets are presumed dead unless the judge verbally announces the target as lost.
- If a target is called as lost, and the shooter wishes to protest the call, the shooter should immediately raise his or her hand. At that time, the judge and scorer will confer to make a final decision.
- Once the next shooter on the firing line has called for pull, no protest from the previous shooters will be allowed.

Divisions

- There are Two Divisions, JUNIOR & SENIOR
- JR Division Grades 7-9 Sr Division 10-12 (for both contest)
- All Shooters will compete as individual Awards.
- The Top Team Award is presented to the high scoring team by calculating the top 4 in sporting clays and top five in trap (Jr or Sr individuals can be consisting of male or female) of the at chapter, club or organization. There **WILL NOT** be a Top Jr Team nor a Top Sr team award. Example: Club A enters 20 individuals and varies with shooters that are Jr and Sr, plus males and female. The top 4 in sporting

clay and 5 in trap out of those 20 individual shooters make up the HIGH SCORE for that club. The club/organization with the highest combined score of those individuals wins the award.

Dead Targets

- A dead target or hit target, is a target that is fired upon and has at least a visible piece broken from it. Dust does not count as a hit.

Clothing & requirements for Competition

- All participants are REQUIRED to hold a hunters education certificate
- Appropriate eye and ear protection is REQUIRED while shooting.
- Closed toe footwear is REQUIRED! The use of toe pads or resting of firearm barrels on any part of the foot is strictly prohibited and could result in disqualification.

Shotguns

- Only shotguns in a safe and serviceable condition that bore sizes of 12 or 20 gauges are allowed.
- Shotguns to be used have to be approved by the coach/Adult prior to the Contest
- Shotguns with release triggers are PROHIBITED
- ALL shotguns will be placed on designated stands for the shoot.

Shotshells

- Shotshell loads will not exceed a shot charge greater than 1 1/8 ounce, a velocity of 1,350 ft/s or contain shot larger than #7 1/2 lead or #6 Steel
- Shotshells must be factory loads or steel loads; reloads are strictly prohibited during ALL practices or competitions
- Loads containing nickel or copper coated shot, tracer loads, or black powder are prohibited
- Shotshells must be shown at check in

Targets

- Targets should not measure more than 4 5/16 inches in diameter, 11/8 inches in Height, and will weigh between 95 and 105 grams.
- Targets will be provided for participants.

Sporting Clays Contest

Rules Not Posted

- All Rules for this contest, that are not posted, will fall back on the *Oklahoma FFA Sporting Clays Event Handbook*. Which is found at the *OKFFA.org* webpage under blue book.

Course of Fire

- (4) shooter will shoot at a time

- Each shooting station will have its individual target presentation (recipe) posted.
- There are 3 rounds per Station, 4 Stations, plus one on deck square

First Round—Beginning with station #1 Shooter

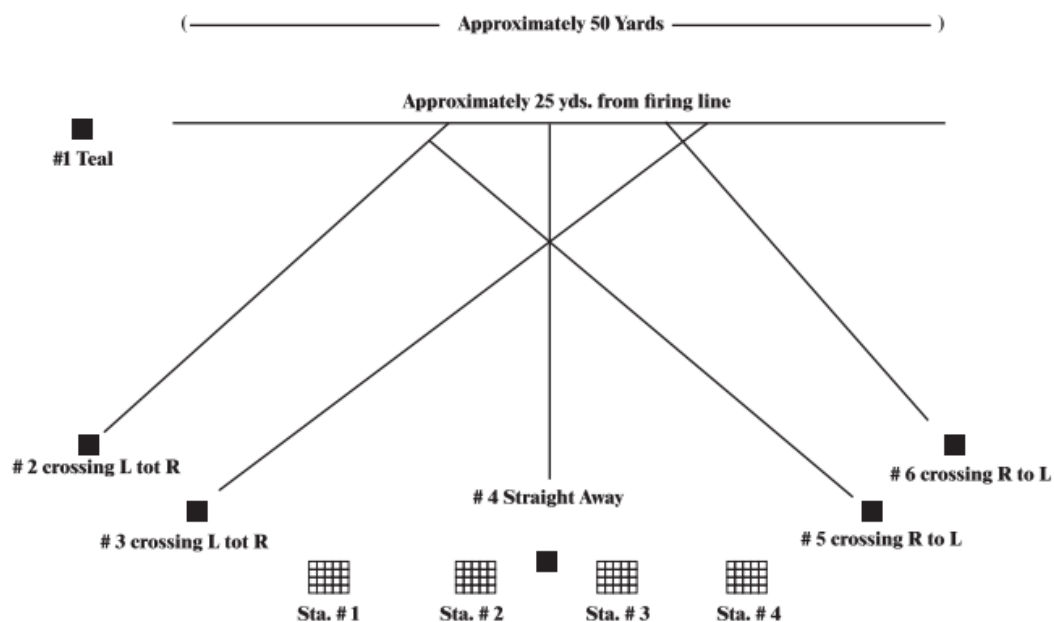
- A single target will be presented. The shooter may shoot two times at this first target. This repeats from each shooter from their individual's station.
- When all four shooters complete this part of the course, the first shooter will begin the next round of fire from the same station.

Second & third Round—Beginning with station #1 Shooter

- A true target pair will be presented theses 2 rounds
- When all four shooters complete their round, the first shooter will begin the next round of fire from the same station.
- After the 3rd round the group will rotate right with an open chamber. Station 4 will rotate to the on-deck square. Shooter 5, which started in the on-deck square, rotates to station 1

Tie Break

- Station 1 will start the count to miss for all tie breaks.



All shooters will rotate to the right. Shooter at Station #4 will go to Station #1.

Trap Contest

Rules Not Posted

- All Rules for this contest, that are not posted, will fall back on the **Oklahoma Scholastic Shooting Sports Program Handbook, Edition 2016**

Event

- Contests consist of 5 shooting stations with 5 targets presented at each station
- Contestants will start at 1 of 5 shooting stations, numbered left to right, spaced three yards apart with each post 16 yards behind the trap field midpoint.
- Firing begins with participant at station 1, and fire in order after the first shooter. After all 5 participants have fired 5 times from each post the contestants will rotate to the right, with the shooter at the last station turning to the right and setting up at station 1. The process will repeat until all participants have fired five shots from each station.
- First shooter to start the contest will always fire first to start a round after each rotation.

Target Flight

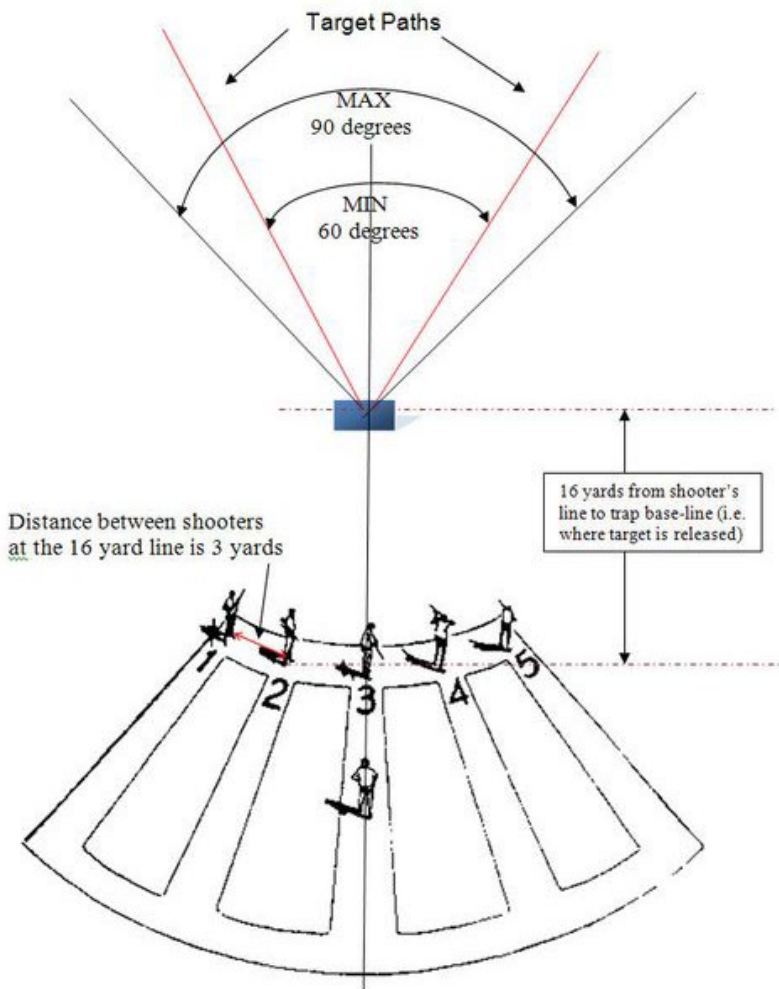
- Targets shall be thrown approximately 50 yards in calm conditions.
- Targets shall be approximately 10 feet high when 10 yards from the trap field midpoint in calm conditions.
- Evaluation of target flight during competition is of sole discretion of Shooting Officials and is not subject to review or protest.

Trap machines

- Trap machines which throw targets at unknown angles shall be used.

Tie Break

- The Station you start at will start the count to miss for all tie breaks.

- This completed Permission Form is required of all participants. Both signatures are required. No exceptions.
- A Hunter Safety Card is required of each member participating. No exceptions. Write Hunter Education # _____
- Each FFA or 4-H member participating must have a minimum of eight hours of shotgun shooting practice to compete.
- Each participant must know how to load and operate their firearm without assistance.
- No first-time shooters. No exceptions. Each participating FFA or 4-H member must have read and understood ALL THE RULES.
- A Parent, FFA Advisor, 4-H Leader MUST BE PRESENT WHILE SHOOTING
- Ammunition will be taken at check-in and returned at the Safety briefing when a participant is on deck, right before you step on the shooting field to compete.
- Under no circumstance will participants keep live ammunition on their persons after checking in and beyond the competition field.

This Permission Form must be presented at the time of check-in for competition for each participant on the date of the event. No exceptions.
